## I. Introduction

- A. Purpose of study
  - 1. everything we know about Paul we know from the New Testament
    - a. we know about his conversion
    - b. he was an apostle
    - c. he wrote more of the New Testament than any other writer
  - 2. in his letters he tells us a great deal about himself
  - 3. purpose of study is to not just know about Paul but to get to know him
- B. His background
  - 1. a Jew religiously and by birth as well as a Pharisee (Philippians 3:5-6; Acts 22:3; 23:6; 26:5; Galatians 1:14)
  - 2. a Roman citizen (Acts 16:35-39; 22:27-29)
  - 3. his intense persecution of the church (Acts 7:58; 8:1-3; 9:1-2; 22:4-5; 26:9-12; Galatians 1:13)
  - 4. his conversion (Acts 9:3-18; 22:6-16; 26:13-18)
- C. Paul after his conversion (Acts 9:20-22; 26:19-20; Galatians 1:15-20)
- D. How Paul was treated after his conversion
  - 1. by Jews (Acts 9:23-24; 13:50; 14:2,5,19; 17:13; 18:12,13; 10:19; 21:27-36; 22:22-23; 23:1,2,10,12-15; 24:1-9; II Corinthians 11:24; I Thessalonians 2:14-16)
  - 2. by Gentiles (Acts 16:19-24; 17:18; 26:24; II Timothy 4:14-15)
  - by some Christians (Acts 9:26; II Corinthians 10:8-12; Philippians 3:18-19;
    II Timothy 1:15; 4:10)
- E. Characteristics of his epistles
  - 1. opening comments about himself
    - a. 7 of them open with statement that he is an apostle by the Lord's will (I Corinthians 1:1; II Corinthians 1:1; Galatians 1:1; Ephesians 1:1; Colossians 1:1; I Timothy 1:1; II Timothy 1:1)
    - b. 2 more open with statement that he is an apostle and a servant (Romans 1:1; Titus 1:1)
    - c. "prisoner" (Philemon 1)
    - d. just his name in I Thessalonians 1:1 and II Thessalonians 1:1
    - e. Hebrews begins without identification
  - 2. first wish for his readers
    - a. grace and peace (Romans 1:7; I Corinthians 1:3; II Corinthians 1:2;
      Galatians 1:3; Ephesians 1:2; Philippians 1:2; Colossians 1:2;
      I Thessalonians 1:1; I Timothy 1:2; II Timothy 1:2; Titus 1:4 {adds "mercy" to Timothy and Titus}; Philemon 3
    - b. no first wish in Hebrews
  - 3. first comment concerning his readers
    - a. thanks to God for their faithfulness (Romans 1:8; Ephesians 1:15-16; Philippians 1:3; Colossians 1:3; I Thessalonians 1:2-3; II Timothy 1:3; Philemon 4)
    - b. thanks to God for blessing them (I Corinthians 1:4-7)
    - c. regarding their suffering (II Corinthians 1:7)
    - d. rebuke for unfaithfulness (Galatians 1:6)
    - e. gets right into instruction (I Timothy 1:3; Titus 1:5; Hebrews 1:1) perhaps a greater sense of urgency in these cases

- 4. concluding comments
  - wish for grace (Romans 16:24; I Corinthians 16:23 {and love vs. 24};
    II Corinthians 13:14 {and love and communion of the Holy Spirit};
    Galatians 6:18; Ephesians 6:24 {and peace and love vs. 23};
    Philippians 4:23; Colossians 4:18; I Thessalonians 5:28; II Thessalonians 3:18; I Timothy 6:21; II Timothy 4:22; Titus 3:15; Philemon 25; Hebrews 13:25)
  - b. also frequently mentioned others in conclusion (Romans 16:21-23; I Corinthians 16:10-12; 19; II Corinthians 13:13; Ephesians 6:21; Philippians 4:21-22; Colossians 4:15; II Timothy 4:19-21; Titus 3:12-13; Philemon 23-24; Hebrews 13:23)
- 5. in general, the impression we get of Paul from reading his epistles is that he had great love and care for the church (II Corinthians 11:28-29)
