Introduction

- I. It is sad, but there are many individuals who do not believe, nor trust in God (Psm. 14:1).
- II. We have been given adequate evidence that shows we should trust in the LORD (Heb. 11:1).

Discussion

- I. Did you know that God thinks about you (Psm. 139:17)?
 - A. He knows when you are happy and sad.
 - B. He knows your victories and defeats.
- II. Did you know that God know your name (Isa. 43:1)?
 - A. God knew men of old like Abram/Abraham and Jacob/Israel.
 - B. Faithful Christians' names are in the book of life (Luke 10:20; Rev. 3:5).
- III. Did you know that God can use you to fulfill His will (Jer. 29:11)?
 - A. Men are supposed to preach God's Word (Mark 16:16).
 - B. Men are supposed edify one another (1 Thess. 5:11-13).
 - C. Men are supposed to be benevolent to others (Gal. 6:10).
- IV. Did you know that God is your refuge (Psalm 62:6-8)?
 - A. Solace, peace and tranquility are given by God (Phil. 4:7).
 - B. Too many try to find refuge in other ways.
- V. Did you know that God is always with you (Matt. 28:20)?
 - A. Many times, men will fail us and disappoint us.
 - B. When all else fails, God never does (Heb. 13:5).
- VI. Did you that God will fight for you (Exo. 14:14).
 - A. Time after time, man has seen that it is fruitless to defy God.
 - B. Whether it was Pharaoh of Egypt, Goliath or many others, they all learned that God wins every time (1 Cor. 15:57).

Conclusion

- I. There are many reasons to trust God, but there is no good reason to doubt Him.
- II. When we submit ourselves to Him, we will learn that our trust in Him is warranted (Rom. 12:1-2).
