John 19:19-30

Introduction

- I. Jesus was well aware of the prophecies concerning Him.
- II. He had diligently been about doing the Father's will.
- III. At the cross, Jesus was allowing for the salvation of mankind (Gen. 3:12-15).

Discussion

- I. Jesus has fulfilled God's promise (Gen. 3:15; Gal. 3:24-25; 2 Cor. 5:17-21).
- II. Jesus has become the antitype for salvation (John 3:14-17; Num. 21:4-9).
- III. Jesus has become the sacrificial Lamb (John 1:29; cf. Exo. 12:5, 46).
 - A. Without blemish
 - B. Bones were not to broken
 - C. Substitution
- IV. Because “it is finished”...
 - A. We serve a resurrected King (1 Cor. 15:5-8; Acts 1:9-11; Heb. 1:3).
 - B. We have a better covenant (Heb. 8:7, 13; 9:22; 10:4).
 - C. We have hope (Heb. 9:27; cf. Rev. 20:14; 2 Cor. 5:1-8).

Conclusion

- I. Jesus has done everything that He needed to do for us to have salvation.
- II. Will we reject such love, or will we humbly obey the Gospel (Rom. 1:16).
