"Spiritual Healing" Mark 5:25-34

Introduction

- I. At some point in our lives, sickness affects us.
- II. We may not "be sick" physically, but accountable individuals "get sick" spiritually.
- III. The source of spiritual healing is God: have we been "healed"?

Discussion

- I. "Sickness" takes a toll on man.
 - A. Hospitals are constantly being used to treat those who are sick.
 - B. The woman in Mark 5:25-34 had suffered for twelve years and continued to get worse.
 - C. "Spiritual sickness" is by far worse than even the ailment of the woman.
 - 1. Ultimately, the pleasures of sin will given over to the realization of our souls' condemnation (Heb. 11:25; Rom. 6:23).
 - 2. Sin will "cost" more than man will want to "pay" (cf. Cain-Gen. 4:13-14 and Saul-1 Sam. 15:24-29).
- II. Healing is found in the Lord.
 - A. The woman trusted so much that she could be healed by the Lord (Mark 5:27-28).
 - B. Likewise, we should trust that we can be "spiritually healed" by the Lord (John 8:24; 14:6; Acts 4:12).
 - C. Ultimately, our trust in the Lord should lead us to obey the Gospel (Rom. 1:16; Heb. 5:9).
- III. Once "healed", man can be at peace.
 - A. The woman, who had suffered so long, was now able to have peace (Mark 5:29-34).
 - B. We, no matter how long we have suffered spiritually, can have peace (Phil. 4:7; 1 John 1:6-7; 5:13; cf. John 14:27).

- I. We need not remain "spiritually sick"!
- II. "Healing" awaits those will obey.
