Introduction

- I. The word “bible” comes from a Greek word that simply means “book” (Heb. 10:7).
- II. It is the “Holy Bible” because it is God's book (1 Pet. 1:15-17).

- I. **B**uy a copy of God's Word (Prov. 23:23).
 - A. Of of the best investments that you could ever make.
 - B. God's book is to be valued over any other book (Acts 19:19).

- II. **I**nvestigate God's Word (John 5:39).
 - A. Ignorance leads to destruction (Hos. 4:6; Eph. 4:18; 1 Cor. 2:8).
 - B. Knowledge of God's Word can keep us from sin (Psm. 119:11).
 - C. It is our responsibility to look and learn (2 Tim. 2:15; 1 Tim. 4:13; 2 Pet 3:18).
- III. **B**elieve God's Word (1 Thess. 2:13) .
 - A. We cannot truly believe in God without believing His Word (Acts 27:25).
 - B. We have reasons to believe God's Word (Psm. 19:1; 2 Tim. 3:16-17).
- IV. **L**ove God's Word (Psm. 19:7-10; Psm.119:47-48, 97, 113, 127, 140, 159, 163, 167).
 - A. There are many who do not love the Bible (2 Thess. 2:10; Matt. 13:15).
 - B. We can not truly love God if we hate His Word (1 John 5:3; Matt. 8:38; Gal. 1:7-9; 2 Cor. 4:1-4).
- V. **E**xemplify God's Word (1 Tim. 4:12).
 - A. It has been said that the lives of Christians are the only Bibles that some will ever read.
 - B. God's Word should be inside our hearts (1 Pet. 3:15; Psm. 119:11; Col. 3:16).
