

# “Questions and Answers”

## Acts 16:25-30

### Introduction

- I. So long as a person is sincere and desires to learn, then there is nothing wrong with asking a question.
- II. Someone counted, and supposedly, the Bible contains 3,226 questions-2,233 in the Old Testament and 993 in the New Testament.
- III. Questions can be one of the best ways to cause a man to be interested.

### Discussion

- I. “Lord, to whom shall we go?” (John 6:68).
  - A. No matter how great a person is, there is only one Jesus (Matt. 1:21; 17:5; Luke 19:10; Acts 3:22-23; 1 Tim. 1:15; Heb. 5:8-9).
  - B. Family and earthly friends cannot save us (Matt. 11:28-30; Acts 4:11-12).
- II. “Where *art* thou? (Gen. 3:9).
  - A. No one can hide from God (Prov. 28:13; Heb. 4:12-13).
  - B. All must give an account (Rom. 14:12; 1 John 5:19).
  - C. Many are still living in sin (John 5:40; Isa. 53:6).
- III. The most important question of all time: “What must I do to be saved?” (Acts 16:30).
  - A. There are things that a man “shall” do to be saved (Matt. 19:16-17; Acts 2:37-38; Rom. 10:9).
  - B. There are things that a man “must” do to be saved (Acts 16:30-33; Acts 9:5-6; 2:16).
- IV. “...what shall the end *be* of them that obey not the gospel of God?” (1 Pet. 4:17).
  - A. The end will be terrible (2 Thess. 1:7-9).
  - B. There will be no more chances (John 14:6).

### Conclusion

- II. We must accept God's answers to our questions.
