

# **“The Lamb's Book of Life”**

## **Rev. 21:22-27**

### Introduction

- I. There are many references to “the book of life” in the Bible (Exo. 32:33; Luke 10:20; Phil. 4:3; Rev. 3:5; 13:8; 20:12, 15; 17:8; 21:27).
- II. What blessings are given to those whose names are written in “the book of life”?

### Discussion

- I. If your name is in “The Lamb's Book of Life”, then you have reason to rejoice!
  - A. The seventy did great things, but none of them were as important as their names being in “the book of life” (Luke 10:17-20).
  - B. Salvation is the gift that you receive (Rom. 6:23; 1 John 3:1).
- II. If your name is in “The Lamb's Book of Life”, then you should have great boldness!
  - A. Boldness should not be confused with arrogance.
  - B. We have access to the throne of God, Who is always our “helper” (Heb. 4:16; 13:6).
  - C. Those who “overcome” need not to worry (Rev. 3:5; Matt. 6:19-21; Rom. 8:36-37; 2 Tim. 1:7).
- III. If your name is in “The Lamb's Book of Life”, then you can have no fear!
  - A. Paul understood the contrast between physical life and everlasting life (Phil. 1:21; cf. Matt. 10:28).
  - B. Jesus went back to “prepare a place” for those who are His (John 14:1-3).
  - C. The crown of righteousness/life is waiting for us (2 Tim. 4:6-8; Rev. 2:10).
  - D. The citizenship of the faithful is in Heaven (Phil. 3:20).

### Conclusion

- I. There truly are wondrous blessings for those whose names are written in “The Lamb's Book of Life”.
- II. We should make sure that, before this life is over, our names are recorded in “Christ's Record” (Rev. 20:14-15).
