Introduction

- I. Did you have a "hero" when you were young?
- II. What made your "hero" worthy of your adoration?
- III. The Bible teaches us about the greatest hero of all time!

Discussion

- I. Our hero was deeply devoted.
 - A. There have been great examples of devotion over the years, but none tops the devotion of Jesus.
 - 1. Cleansing the Temple (John 2:13-17).
 - 2. Dealing with temptations (Matt. 4:1-11).
 - 3. During His struggles (Matt. 26:38-42).
 - B. Jesus was completely devoted to His Father (John 4:34; cf. even when it took dying to do such [John 10:17-18; 15:13]).
- II. Our hero is a legendary leader.
 - A. Many names come to mind when thinking of great leaders, but none tops the leadership of Jesus.
 - 1. Almost 2,000 years have lapsed since His death, yet He still leads the church (Eph. 5:23-24; Matt. 28:18; 1 Tim. 6:15).
 - 2. Jesus leads by example (1 Pet. 2:21-22; 1 John 3:5).
 - B. We follow our leader/hero because of His great love for us (John 15:13; 1 John 4:19).
- III. Our hero is an excellent executor.
 - A. There have been various ones that have left us in awe of their abilities and accomplishment, but none tops the execution of Jesus.
 - 1. It is His Gospel that is the power of God unto salvation (Rom. 1:16).
 - 2. It is His name whereby men must be saved (Acts 4:12; John 14:6).
 - 3. It is His resurrection that gives us hope of eternal life (1 Cor. 6:14).
 - 4. It is His blood that cleanses us (Rev. 1:5).
 - B. He is still busy today (Heb. 4:14-15; 1 John 2:1-2).

- I. Choose Jesus as your hero, but more importantly as your Savior.
- II. Obey the Gospel, and strive to be more like your hero every day.
