 - B. What are some consequences of a backbiting mouth (Prov. 16:28; 17:9 cf. 1 Pet. 4:8; Eccl. 10:20; James 4:11; Rom. 1:30).
- IV. A proud mouth is froward.
 - A. This is an expression of a bad attitude.
 - B. How does a proud mouth reveal itself (Psm. 12:3-4; 2 Pet. 10-11).
 - C. What will be the end of the proud mouth (Prov. 13:3; Matt. 12:36-37).
