 - A. Just because tragedies happen, it does not mean that God purposed them (Job 2:9-10).
 - B. Many times, our decisions and actions are to blame.

 - A. Eutychus was listening to the preaching of God's Word (Acts 20:9).
 - B. "Let me die the death of the righteous, and let my last end be like his (Num. 23:10).
 - C. We will all die, but not all will die righteous (Heb. 9:27).
- IV. Why do so many "sleep" on the Gospel?
 - A. It is not always the fault of the preacher (after all, Paul was a masterful preacher).
 - B. Paul had other times where the message was rejected (Acts 17:1-5).
 - C. Some think that they have "plenty of time" (Matt. 20:6-8).
 - D. Some just do not believe that Christ will judge people "guilty as charged" (2 Thess. 1:7-9).
