  - C. It should bother us that so many are unwilling to show a penitent attitude (Matt. 23:37; James 4:8-10).
- II. God expects sinners to make corrections in an urgent manner.
  - A. We should take advantage of the time that God has given (Eph. 5:16; 2 Cor. 6:2; James 4:13-17).
  - B. All of us will eventually run out of time (Heb. 9:27; Eccl. 12:5-7).
- III. God will not accept our excuses.
  - A. We must relinquish whatever it is that is holding us (Heb. 12:1-4).
  - B. God is not joking when He warns us (Heb. 10:26-31; Luke 14:16-24).
