Heb. 2:1-4

Introduction

- I. Every person has certain things that we cannot avoid.
- II. No matter what, including ignorance, we must face these things.
- III. Let us notice some inevitable things that we each must face.

Discussion

- I. God's omnipresence (Prov. 15:3; Heb. 4:13).
 - A. This should be a deterrent from sin.
 - B. Some have tried to get away from God, but there is no escaping His presence (Jonah 1:3; Psm. 139:7-10).
 - C. Even our very thoughts are known of God (1 Chr. 28:9; Rev. 2:23).
- II. Responsibility for our actions (Matt. 7:21-23).
 - A. God has certain things that he has prescribed for mankind.
 - B. Pure, undefiled religion must be practice (James 1:27).
 - C. Faithfulness must be observed (Matt. 10:22; 24:12-13; Rev. 2:10).
 - D. Fishing for men (2 Tim. 2:2; 1 Pet. 3:15; James 5:20).
 - E. Parents and children (Eph. 6:1-4).
- III. Consequences of sin (Rom. 6:23; Gal. 6:7-8).
 - A. We must not provoke God to wrath (Hos. 8:7; Ezek. 8:18).
 - B. Sometimes some consequences are experienced in our physical lives.
- IV. Death (Heb. 9:27; Eccl. 9:5).
 - A. Even the aged Methuselah died (Gen. 5:27).
 - B. The Lord died (Matt. 28:50).
 - C. We should make preparations for such (Eccl. 7:2; 1 Kings 2:2; Rev. 14:13).
- V. Judgment (2 Cor. 5:10; Acts 17:30-31).
 - A. We will all be judged by the Word of God (John 12:48; Rom. 2:16; Rev. 20:11-12).
 - B. Each person will bow (Rom. 14:10-12).
 - C. Pronouncement of saved or lost (Matt. 25:34, 41).
