Introduction

Discussion

- I. We must always trust God even when our knowledge is limited (Gen. 12:1-5; Heb. 11:8).
 - A. We do not know everything, and that is okay (Deut. 29:29).
 - B. Instead of focusing on what we do not know, we should trust because of what we do know (2 Cor. 5:7; Heb. 11:1).
- II. We must always trust God even when it seems impossible (Jer. 32:17, 27; Matt. 19:26; Luke 1:26-37).
 - A. Man's ways and God's ways are not always the same (Isa. 55:8-9).
 - B. If God could create the universe from absolutely nothing, then we trust that He will handle things in His own way (Gen. 1:1).
- III. We must always trust God even when we feel weak (1 Sam. 17:32-51; Jud. 8:4-12; Col. 1:23).
 - A. There is no weakness when God is fighting for us (Rom. 8:35-39; 1 Cor. 15:57).
 - B. Paul understood that it is the strength of God that is important, not our own (Phil. 4:11-13; 2 Cor. 12:7-10).
